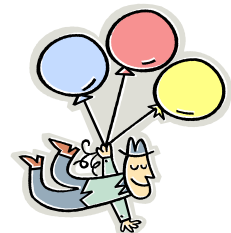

A charter member of the faculty of Palm Beach Atlantic College when it was founded in 1968, Stanley Brown Doyle also served as the Director of Music at Holy Trinity Episcopal Church from 1972 until his death in 1989. As Holy Trinity celebrates its 100th birthday this year, we honor the accomplishments of this unique individual by renewing our collaboration with the fine educational institution he helped to create. The concert will feature the 50-piece orchestra in W. A. Mozart's *Eine Kleine Nachtmusik*, Walter Piston's *Prelude and Allegro for Organ and Strings*, and Franz Schubert's *Symphony No. 8*. There will be a special presentation of Mr. Doyle's *She Shall be Praised* with soprano Sarah Nell Summers, who sang the work when it was first performed in 1978. Proceeds from this concert will benefit the Stanley B. Doyle Music Scholarship Fund at Palm Beach Atlantic University and the Holy Trinity Beautification and Restoration Project—Centennial Fund.

Join other people of faith as we SleepOut overnight at The Meyer Amphitheater to raise funds to help The Lord's Place in its efforts to end homelessness in Palm Beach County.

On Friday, Feb. 8 we will meet at the Meyer Amphitheater (Flagler Drive between Datura and Evernia Streets in Downtown West Palm Beach) and join others in The Lord's Place SleepOut to end homelessness.

From 7 p.m. to 7 a.m. on Sat., Feb. 9, we will sleep out under the stars to experience what the 4,000 homeless men, women and children who live in our community experience each day. An inspirational film will be shown and we will hear the life stories of men and women who have been helped out of homelessness by The Lord's Place.

Group registration (8 or more) rates are \$20 per person. Those who can't SleepOut can organize a SleepIn at their home. The Lord's Place will send SleepIn participants a package to organize their event and to educate their families about how they can work with others to end homelessness in our community.
